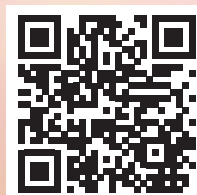

For Luck and Ash, that promise became a lifeline. Adopted as kittens in 2018, they spent years as beloved family members. Then, in February 2026, their world was turned upside down when they were surrendered to Suffolk Animal Control in Suffolk, Virginia due to a terminal illness in their family. It was a heartbreaking situation—and through no fault of their own, they suddenly found themselves in a shelter environment.

Because their microchips identified them as Friends of Cats alumni, Suffolk Animal Control reached out to us right away. After speaking with their team and learning more about their low adoption rates, we knew we couldn't leave their future to chance. The safest, kindest place for Ash and Luck was back with us—back with the people who promised they'd always have a home to return to.

With heartfelt thanks to Suffolk Animal Control, Grey's Courier for transport, and the family of one of our board members who helped locally, Ash and Luck are now back in Friends of Cats care—safe, secure, and surrounded by compassion as they settle in again.

And there's a hopeful next chapter, too: Ash is now available for adoption and ready to find a loving new family of her own. Luck will hopefully join her soon, following a quick recheck exam with our veterinarian.

Our Roof Is on The Last of its Nine Lives

After 40 years of tireless service, the main shelter building roof at Friends of Cats has more than earned a heartfelt thank-you, and a replacement. In recent years, each rainstorm has felt like a game of whack-a-mole as we scramble to track down leaks and make emergency repairs. Unfortunately, the situation is now causing more serious and extensive interior damage, including ceiling failures, wall damage, damaged light fixtures, and flooring issues in our medical areas as shown in these recent photos from a February 2026 rain event. Fortunately, no cats or staff member have been injured as a result of the damage.



In addition, the shelter's two rooftop heating and air conditioning systems (HVAC), approximately 20 and 30 years old, are reaching the end of their service life. Replacement parts are becoming increasingly difficult to find, making reliable operation more challenging.

To address these urgent needs, we will be launching a fundraising campaign in the near future to replace the roof and HVAC systems and are currently in the process of requesting quotes for both. Please keep an eye out for future updates; your support will help us protect the shelter and ensure we can continue providing safe care for the cats who depend on us.



Purr-venting Overheating: Cat Summer Safety

On the hottest summer days, cats may act extra sleepy, stretched out like little furry puddles, and suddenly very committed to napping in the coolest corner of the house. That's their way of coping with the heat and a few small changes from us can make a big difference.

Start with fresh water everywhere. Many cats drink more when they have options, so add a couple extra bowls in their favorite hangouts, or try a pet water fountain to encourage sipping. Keep your home cooler by closing blinds during the sunniest part of the day, and set out a cool surface like a tile area, a cooling mat, or even a damp (not icy) washcloth they can lie near.

Grooming helps, too. Regular brushing removes excess fur and can make your cat more comfortable, especially for long-haired cats. And if your cat likes window time, make sure there's shade and airflow—a sunny windowsill can turn into a toaster oven.

Most of all, watch for signs of overheating like heavy panting, drooling, or unusual lethargy, and call your vet if anything seems off. Summer should mean more purrs and fewer heatwaves - for everyone in the house.
